#### **Tabarca trip 10 September by John Mail**

For about 2 weeks we had been looking at the weather forecasts for Tabarca with some alarm. A day of heavy storms was predicted on Sept 10th, our proposed "Grand Day Out". To our delight a few days before the forecast, the storms shifted to the day before and all was well.

On the Wednesday we woke to clear blue skies and much less humid air. Everybody met in Santa Pola for a coffee before catching the 11.30 crossing to the Island. We had a meal review at Restaurante "Raconet de Ramos" before scattering off to explore the Island, go swimming and snorkelling. The unstable weather was still having an effect on the Southern side of Tabarca where we had hoped to swim, so we hiked across to the Northern coast to find calm, clear water and lots of fish to see.



We then all headed to the restaurant for lunch, where our table for 20 had been set out with panoramic views over the med and the mainland coast. A fine menu followed with fresh bread, Ali Oli, Grated tomato, mixed salad, fried Calamari, fried anchovy, a variety of rice dishes cooked freshly for us, (plus a couple of non-rice dishes for those that preferred), a mixed selection of desserts and as much wine, beer and water as we wanted. The meal concluded with a glass of cava each and some lively music. Quite a few of us needed a walk around the village afterwards to aid digestion before catching the 5 pm ferry back to the mainland through quite lumpy seas!

#### Shortest Away Trip Ever! August 2026 by John & Clodagh Mail

Next August a rare event will take place here in Spain. On August 12th at about 8.30pm part of Spain will witness a total eclipse of the sun. Unfortunately the Costa Blanca will not see a total eclipse.

Clodagh & I have decided we would like to see it and plan to travel to hotel Pepo in Benifallet (near Tortosa, www.restaurantpepo.com) and stay for 2 nights to put us in the shadow area. We will need to find a vantage point looking West as the sun will be fairly low and we would like to witness the encroaching moon shadow as it races towards us at 1000 mph! A high vantage point such as Cim Caro at 1400m would be perfect. The viewing area at the top and parking is limited and half of the local population will probably be up there! We are still searching for a good vantage point. Horta de San Joan might be OK as it is built on a hill.

It is likely to be very hot and hiking to a hilltop is not on our agenda. Hotel Pepo still has vacancies for August 11th & 12th. We would be happy to see a few friends up there if you fancy joining us. I am not actually organising anything as Booking.com can do all the reservations for those interested. Cost is about 80€ per night for double room including breakfast.
